**Educational goals and characteristics**

The fellowship in Bone and Cartilage Transplantation and Joint Revision Surgery is divided equally between public practice in the Princess Alexandra Hospital in Brisbane and the supervisor's private practice in that same city. An emphasis is placed on bone and tissue banking and transplantation within the subspecialty of joint revision surgery. The fellow will be attached to the Queensland Bone Bank and will assume some administrative duties in that regard. The fellow will also be involved in routine joint replacement surgery of both primary and revision nature, and will have some commitment to the Acute Traumatic Orthopaedic Service at the Princess Alexandra Hospital.

It is envisaged that during the twelve month course of this fellowship the applicant will become proficient in bone and tissue banking, joint revision surgery, will be exposed to ongoing prospective clinical research programs and will also have an opportunity to be involved in a basic scientific research program. It is expected that at least one publication in a refereed journal will ensue.

**Affiliations**

This fellowship is affiliated with the Biomedical Science and Engineering Unit within the Queensland University of Technology. It also has links with the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery within the University of Queensland. These affiliations allow integration with undergraduate and post-graduate teaching programs and research programs of a basic scientific nature.

**Requirements**

The successful applicant will hold a higher degree in orthopaedic surgery from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons, will be Board-eligible or Board-certified, or some equivalent or nearly so. The applicant must also be registerable as a medical practitioner within the State of Queensland.

**How to apply**

Applications including a detailed curriculum vitae and the names of three referees with whom the applicant has worked recently should be lodged by 30 March, fifteen months prior to the commencement date in July of the following year. Applications should be submitted to the supervisor at the above address.
