Length	6 months full time (38 hours per week)	
Stipend	AUD \$45,000 stipend per six-month fellowship period.  Costs related to obtaining a training visa for the fellowship (sponsor is Epworth Hospital), registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency, RACS (Royal Australasian College of Surgeons) assessment, and English language testing (IELTS) may be incurred based on individual requirements.

Educational goals and characteristics	This is primarily a clinical fellowship encompassing all aspects of shoulder and elbow surgery. The main focus is the shoulder, with around 90% of the overall case load related to shoulder conditions. A small amount of trauma work is conducted.	
	A specific goal of the fellowship is in improvement of arthroscopic skills, particularly in the shoulder, and the management of sports injuries. Joint arthroplasty is performed with attention to computer assisted techniques and management of complex glenoid deformity and revision. Currently routine use of PSI and augmented reality technology is provided. Funding is multi-sourced and there is exposure to a variety of brands of arthroplasty and soft tissue repair implants.	
	The fellow wil	I work with a number of upper limb surgeons in addition to the chief

	supervisor and this is incorporated into the weekly timetable. Flexibility exists within the timetable to cater for particular interests and for research requirements. Additional expectations during the fellowship are attendance at journal reading evenings held through the Victorian Shoulder and Elbow Society (VSES) and at the quarterly Epworth orthopaedic morbidity and mortality audit. Quarterly meetings of the VSES are conducted and a short presentation at one of these is required. Monthly radiology meetings are conducted with affiliated centres.  Two weeks of paid leave are available during the 6 months post.  Research is conducted through the Musculoskeletal Institute at Epworth hospital. There is access at the Richmond campus to a fully equipped library including assistance with literature searches. At least one research project suitable for publication should be engaged in during the fellowship period.
Requirements/ criteria	The fellowship is open only to fully qualified orthopaedic surgeons. At least moderate ability in arthroscopic surgery is preferred.  Eligibility for registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency is required. <a href="www.ahpra.gov.au">www.ahpra.gov.au</a> International candidates must have completed the IELTS English language test with a minimum score of 7 in every section (or equivalent English test accepted by AHPRA) This is a strict criterion for registration with the Medical Board of Australia. Graduates from Universities in the United States of America, Canada, New Zealand, United Kingdom, Republic of Ireland and South Africa may be exempt.
