Educational goals and characteristics	 This fellowship is catered towards aspiring knee surgeons, with an interest in all aspects of knee surgery including both paediatric and adult patients. Particular areas of interest include: ACL and revision ACL reconstruction Multi-ligament knee reconstruction, complex knee trauma Primary and revision knee arthroplasty Unicompartmental knee arthroplasty Robotically-assisted knee arthroplasty Knee preservation surgery, meniscal and osteochondral allograft transplant Osteotomy and re-alignment surgery The Perth Knee Fellowship is conducted in both the public and private health sectors. Time is spent in surgery and assessing patients in the clinic setting with weekly attendance at grand rounds and clinical meetings. The prospective fellow is required to undertake clinical research during the fellowship, with journal publication expected. Attendance and presentation at State, National and International meeting is encouraged. 	
Requirements/ criteria	The prospective fellow is a medical graduate who has completed Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (FRACS) or an equivalent training program. Registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) is mandatory.	

	 Applicants require a keen interest in knee arthroplasty and reconstructive surgery. This fellowship is a subspecialty fellowship, designed for surgeons who already possess skills and experience consistent with completion of an orthopaedic surgical training scheme. Applicants will have experience in surgery as primary surgeon during their previous training scheme. Overseas candidates must satisfy requirements to enter Australia on an occupational training visa. AHPRA English proficiency test must be met.
